Suggestions for Use

Processional

- •Play the processional by adding parts every two measures as follows: Part I; Part II; Part IV; Part V
- •The bell ostinato (mm. 11-12) may be used as an alternative processional.
- •The bell part, m. 11 to the end, may be played with handchimes.
- •The processional may be omitted entirely, beginning the anthem at m. 3.


Kyrie

- •The entire piece may be sung with cantor, congregation, and piano only.
- •The piece may be accompanied by string quartet instead of piano. (String parts on page 11.)
- •If using string quartet as accompaniment, have them play mm. 3-8 of their part as an introduction.
- •If using the bell ostinato (mm. 11-12) as a processional, the string parts can be added one at a time during the processional.
- •Any of the string parts can be added at various times in place of, or in addition to, the C treble instrument part.
