## Notes on the Music



Fantasy on Liverpool is based on two themes. The first is the hymn tune LIVERPOOL by John Roberts (1822-1877). Teacher, editor, minister, journalist, lecturer, poet, composer and conductor, Roberts lived in Liverpool from 1852 to 1858. This melody is an alternate tune for the famous lyrics "Nearer My God to Thee".

The second theme is the name "Liverpool" spelled out in musical notes (measures 19-20).




The newly-added lyrics convey that bells are an effective tool for achieving unity and harmony.




