


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SONG TEACHING STEPS



"He's Got the Whole World in His Hands"

1. Discuss the song, and teach Verse 1 (mm. 3-10).

- Read 1 John 3:1 aloud.
- Remind children that God loves us so much He made us part of His family. Invite children to discuss what it means to be part of a family.
- Tell children: "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands" is a spiritual, a type of song that was sung by African-Americans when they were slaves. These songs were sung to express faith, sorrow, and hope, while slaves endured the extreme hardships of slavery.
- Display "He's Got the Whole World" Memory Visuals, and draw attention to the visual for Verse 1.
- Echo sing Verse 1 while demonstrating the motions.
 - He's got the whole world—draw a semi-circle overhead with one arm
 - ° **in His hands**—cup hands together in front of body
- Sing the entire Verse together without accompaniment.
- Sing Verse 1 with Demo 3, Track 4, or piano accompaniment. (pause the recording afterward, if using)

2. Review Verse 1, and teach Verses 2, 3, and 4 (mm. 13-20, 23-30, and 42-49).

- Display "He's Got the Whole World" Memory Visuals and refer to them accordingly while teaching each verse.
- Sing and perform the motions for Verse 1 with Demo 3, Track 4, or piano accompaniment.
- Echo sing Verse 2 while demonstrating the motions.
 - He's got our friends and neighbors—wave with one hand, then the other
 - ° in His hands—cup hands together in front of body
- Sing Verse 2 with Demo 3, Track 4, or piano accompaniment. (pause the recording afterward, if using)
- Echo sing Verse 3 while demonstrating the motions.
 - He's got you and me—point out with both pointer fingers, then point to self with both pointer fingers
 - ° in His Hands—cup hands together in front of body
- Tell children Verse 3 is slower and softer than the other verses.
- Sing Verse 3 with Demo 3, Track, 4, or piano accompaniment. (pause the recording afterward, if using)

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Score

PREPARATION

- Copy Student Score.
- Print and prepare visuals.

- Echo sing Verse 4 while demonstrating the motions.
 - He's got the whole wide world—use both arms to draw a full circle overhead, outward, and down
 - ° **in His hands**—cup hands together in front of body
- Tell children Verse 4 is sung at a *f* dynamic.
- Sing Verse 4 with Demo 3, Track 4, or piano accompaniment.

3. Teach the partner song (mm. 32-39).

- Distribute Student Scores and display "He's Got the Whole World" Memory Visuals.
- Sing from the beginning through Verse 3 with Track 4 or piano accompaniment.
- Have children locate measure 32, and point out that this section works as a partner song for the melody used in each verse.
- Echo sing the Partner Song in two-measure phrases until children are secure.
- Sing the section with Demo 3, Track 4, or piano accompaniment.
- Demonstrate and practice the motions for the partner song.
 - We are God's children—hold hands out to either side, then face palms down and pretend to pat children's heads, from the middle outward
 - God loves His children—form fists and cross arms over chest, then face palms down and pretend to pat children's heads, from the middle outward
 - ° and holds us in His hands-cup hands together in front of body
- Sing the partner song once again with Track 4 or piano accompaniment, this time performing the motions.

4. Pair partner melodies, and teach the Ending (mm. 50-54).

- Display "He's Got the Whole World" Memory Visuals.
- Distribute Student Scores.
- Review melody and motions for the Partner Song.
- Review melody and motions for Verse 4.
- Have children locate measure 42, and point out both melodies are sung at the same time. Divide children into Groups 1 and 2, and assign Verse 4 to Group 1 and the Partner Song to Group 2.
- Lead both groups in singing together with the piano playing both parts. Address any insecurities and repeat as needed.
- Invite each group to compare the final phrase of their melody (mm. 48-49) to each phrase in the Ending. (the notes are the same [other than the final note-length], but dynamics change to mp, then back to f)
- Sing from measure 42 to the end with Track 4 or piano accompaniment.


5. Memorize and polish.

- Display "He's Got the Whole World" Memory Visuals.
- Divide children into Groups 1 and 2.
- Remind children that everyone sings the Partner Song the first time, then they divide to sing Verse 4 with the Partner Song at the end.
- Sing and perform the motions for the entire song with Track 4 or piano accompaniment.
- Identify any problem spots and rehearse as needed.
- Remove memory visuals, and have children review the key words for each verse/section.
 - ° Verse 1-whole world
 - ° Verse 2–friends and neighbors
 - ° Verse 3-you and me
 - ° Partner Song-we are God's children
 - ° Verse 4-whole wide world
- Sing the entire song from memory with Track 4 or piano accompaniment.

Performance Option

Enlist a guitar player for the performance; a guitar chart is provided in the Songs folder.













ACTIVITY TEACHING STEPS



"Ciranda, Cirandinha"

1. Introduce the activity, and teach the circle dance.

- Tell children the folk song used for this activity is called "Ciranda, Cirandinha" (see-RAHN-dah see-rahn-JEEN-yah) and comes from the country Brazil. Point out the location of Brazil on a world map or globe. (optional)
- Explain that a ciranda (see-RAHN-dah) is a traditional dance in Brazil
 where people hold hands in order to dance in a circle. A cirandinha
 (see-rahn-JEEN-yah) is a small ciranda, often used as a singing game
 by children.
- Have children form a standing circle by holding hands.
- Remind children that a circle reminds us of God's love; there is no beginning or end and there is room for everyone.

Teaching Tip

To view a video demonstration of the dance, go to: growing-in-grace.com/ciranda

- Lead children in practicing the circle dance movements:
 - "Ciranda, cirandinha" take my hand and sing along—circle to the right for eight beats
 - ° Come and join our "cirandinha," all are welcome, all belong—circle to the left for eight beats
 - So move it to the beat, and lightly step your feet—take four steps toward the middle of the circle, then take four steps back
 - Lift your hands up high and then down low and here comes the repeat—raise hands up high, lower hands, step three times in place
- Tell children the music begins slowly, then gets a little faster each time. (NOTE: The movements repeat four times.)
- Play Demo 21, and lead children through the dance. (NOTE: There is an eight-beat introduction before the movements begin.)

2. Discuss Tempo.

- Display Animal Tempo Visuals, folded in half to show only the animal and tempo term.
- Invite volunteers to describe the relative speed of each animal. (tortoise-slow, hedgehog-walking speed, rabbit-medium, cheetah-fast)
- Point out each animal's tempo term, and have children practice pronouncing each one. (i.e., Largo means slow, Andante means walking speed, Moderato means medium, Allegro means fast)

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Score (pages 3-4 of these Teaching Steps)
- Student Score (page 5 of these Teaching Steps)
- Demo 21
- Track 22
- Animal Tempo Visuals (General)
- World map or globe (optional)
- Metronome
- Collection of non-pitched percussion instruments, enough for half the group
- "Ciranda, Cirandinha" Activity Video

PREPARATION

- Copy Student Score.
- Print and prepare visuals.
- Locate Brazil on the world map or globe. (optional)
- Watch the video to become familiar with the activity.

Animal Tempo Visuals









- Turn visuals over to reveal the speed limit signs on each.
- Tell children each number stands for how many beats per minute that tempo would have. Use a metronome to illustrate what each tempo sounds like.
- Unfold visuals, arrange in order from slowest to fastest, and tell children the visuals illustrate the tempos used for "Ciranda, Cirandinha."
- Review circle dance movements, and perform the dance with Demo 21.

3. Add steady-beat instruments.

- Display Animal Tempo Visuals and review the four tempos used in "Ciranda, Cirandinha."
- Divide children into two groups, assigning Group 1 to play the steady beat on non-pitched percussion instruments, and Group 2 to perform the dance.

Teaching Tip

Pre-designate a place in the room for instruments by laying them out in advance.

- Play Demo 21, and lead children in performing the dance and playing the steady beat on the instruments in four different tempos.
- Have children swap parts, and repeat.

Options

- Allow children playing instruments to improvise their own percussion rhythms instead of just the steady beat.
- If you have enough non-pitched instruments for all children to play simultaneously, divide children into two instrument groups, assigning Group 1 the steady beat, and Group 2 to improvise their own rhythms. Have children play along with Demo 21. Swap parts and repeat.
- Combine all three: divide children into three groups, assigning Group 1 instruments to play the steady beat, Group 2 instruments to improvise their own rhythms, and Group 3 to perform the dance. Swap parts and repeat as time allows.

- Play Demo 11 while children work. (optional)


EXTENSIONS
