
# Dido's Lament

The story line of Purcell's opera, "Dido and Aeneas" is taken from Book IV of Virgil's "Aeneid," which follows the lives of Dido, Queen of Carthage and the Trojan prince, Aeneas, leading to her eventual acceptance of his marriage proposal in Act I.

However, deception and sorcery follow in Act II as underhanded forces plot and succeed in tearing them apart.

At the end of Act III, Dido, shortly before her death, sings "When I Am Laid in Earth," indisputably one of the most emotional and heart-wrenching of all Baroque arias.

The work is supported by a ground bass, in this case, a chromatically descending line that repeats continuously throughout, further heightening the tension and tragic mood.

As might well be imagined for a piece of music of this nature, countless appearances have been made in film and television productions. Of special note is Jessye Norman's iconic performance, which may be viewed on YouTube.
