## Ezekiel Saw the Wheel




\*Percussion note/suggestion: Three sounds can be produced from each drum -- "o" signifies open, no muffling of drum head; "+" signifies muting or muffling by placing a hand or fingers on the head as it is played; "x" is a note played near the rim (as opposed to playing near the center of the head); since these notes are played "+," this will produce a "pop"-ping sound from the drum. To execute this suggested pattern, Left strikes open head, then Right strikes and remains on the head, muting the sound; followed by L near rim (muted already by R); R lifts for L to play fourth note open. Pattern reverses on high drum. Use similar technique for pattern, m. 5.

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\*Ringers should make a definite distinction between these eighth note-eighth rest rhythms, and the similar rhythms with the added "RT," being sure to play the former as a full eighth note and damping on the upbeat, while making the "RT" as short as possible.



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
