IMAGINEGOD! ProductionGuide

Suggestions for creative expression and craft activities, dance movement, Biblical discovery, ministry projects, and multi-generational participation are presented here to offer multi-sensory approaches to exploring and expressing the images found in *Imagine God!* (CCG48). These activities include ideas and coordination with the children to internalize the meaning fully through repeated hearings. Consider incorporating these ideas and activities into weekly choir rehearsals, summer music camp, vacation Bible School.

Table Images

Usually, the representation of them usical, a combination of symbols accumulates with symbols that represent the message of God's expression of the musical (see page 9). If performed in a church sanctuary, the communion elements are worked around the altar. The tables should be covered with a cloth of white fabric or a nativity scene usually represented by items such as lilies or lacedo on the table. Boxes may be placed underneath the cloth or various levels of placement of the symbols.

During the representation of the musical, the appropriate symbols are brought out immediately after the arrangement of the symbols. At this point, symbols such as lacedo on the table, an upward *glissando* is placed on the tree (representing imagination).

Suggestions for symbols related to each song title. (No symbols required for the openings song, "Imagine God," or the reprise.) Some of the suggested symbols may be purchased readily available. The other symbols may be cut out by the children, who may then use them to create visual symbols that help them remember our faith community.

Symbol: a nest with eggs

Symbols: Right hand - blue quill pen above; breath and reentry in vase; Jesus - blue oil paint ready to paint.

The "breath of life" image can provide an interesting discussion with our children. Explain that literally providing oxygen to our lungs is literally providing oxygen to living creatures on Earth. Paint them, make fittings symbols or "Ruah." Ask children how they would usually depict breath? Consider Jesus singing here instead of symbols or "breath of life."







