Options for Use

- 1. Handbells and organ (with or without timpani)
- 2. Handbells and brass (with or without timpani)

Full Score

- 3. Handbells, organ and brass (with or without timpani)
- 4. Handbells, organ and solo trumpet (with or without timpani)

In options 3 and 4 above, the brass/solo trumpet may tacet mm. 29-63, entering at m. 64. When brass substitutes for organ (option 2 above), the brass plays throughout.

Additional Options for Use With Congregational Singing

- 1. Following the introduction, the congregation sings stanza 1 accompanied by Variation I (mm. 14-28.) Bells and brass tacet measures 29-63, while congregation sings other stanzas from the hymnal with organ accompaniment. The final stanza begins at m. 64, with the congregation extending the last three notes at the indication of the choir director. Handbells, organ and/or brass conclude the hymn.
- 2. Handbells with organ and/or brass play the entire piece as written. Congregation enters to sing two stanzas, accompanied by Variation I (mm. 14-28) and Variation IV (mm. 64-76.)
- 3. Use the introduction and stanza 1 (Variation I) with the congregation, ending with m. 28. Repeat Variation I (mm. 14-28) to accompany the singing of the final stanza.




